With the **Coronavirus Global Response**, the European Union is joining forces with global partners to kick-start a pledging effort starting on 4 May 2020, with more milestones to come.

The initial goal: to raise €7.5 billion in pledges. This is only the beginning. More will be needed in the future.

The European Commission is pledging €1 billion in grants and €400 million in guarantees on loans to the Coronavirus Global Response. This includes €1 billion from the EU's research and innovation programme, Horizon 2020, €150 million from the Emergency Support Instrument, €80 million from RescEU and €170 million from external instruments.

TIMELINE

MARCH 2020

26/03

The G20, under the Saudi presidency and with the European Commission, decided to establish a global initiative on pandemic preparedness and response.

President von der Leyen tasked a team of Commissioners to prepare for a global online pledging initiative in cooperation with global partners.

APRIL 2020

15-17/04

President von der Leyen engaged with global actors (the WHO, Gavi, the Vaccine Alliance, the Global Preparedness Monitoring Board, the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation and the Wellcome Trust) to bring them together and help align their efforts.

24/04

The WHO and a group of global health actors, launched a collaboration for an accelerated development, production and equitable global Access to COVID-19 Tools – the ACT Accelerator. Together, they issued a call to action.

MAY 2020

4/05

Responding to this call on the very same day, the European Union announced that it was joining forces with global partners to kick-start a pledging effort, the **Coronavirus Global Response**, starting on 4 May 2020.

END OF MAY

Pledging marathon ends.

JUNE 2020

BEGINNING OF JUNE

Gavi, the Vaccine Alliance, the global actor for vaccine deployment, will organise its replenishment summit on 4 June 2020. As the world relies on Gavi for making vaccination available everywhere, its full replenishment will be crucial to the success of the Coronavirus Global Response.
