




EXTREME SURVIVAL MEASURES

NUTRITION, HEALTH AND POLIO



3.3 million children affected by acute malnutrition

increase in admission of SAM cases in June 2022 compared to June 2021xxi.



of under-5 SAM new admissions are girls and 42% are boysxxii.



increase in malnutrition amongst pregnant and lactating mothers, compared to June last year.xxiii.



cases of measles 58,000 reported between January and July 2022xix.



Afghanistan is still a polio endemic country. As of July 2022, one case of wild polio virus (WPV1) has been reportedxxiv.

people have been fully vaccinated against 5.1 million COVID-19 (7.9 million doses administered)xxvi.

increase in cases of acute watery diarrhoea compared to June 2021xxvii.




Around 8 in 10 Afghans are drinking bacteriologically contaminated waterxxviii.


